Future Pathways / College Night, Financial Aid, CTE, MJC Dual Enrollment & **College Applications**

<u>Join us for Future Pathways/College Night...October 12th 5;30-7:30pm</u>

On October 12th from 5;30-7:30pm TUSD invites you to attend our in person Future Pathways/ College Night event. The evening will include an overview of the many types of higher education opportunities available to your student, regardless of their career path. We will have various breakout sessions covering Financial Aid, Dual Enrollment, MJC CTE Pathways, and info on NCAA. Several colleges, universities and trade school programs will be represented... so come check it out!

Financial Aid

Financing college is one of the greatest stressors for students and parents alike in deciding to further their education. Luckily there are MANY options to help ease the burden of ever increasing tuition and fees. In order to qualify for financial aid, a student must complete the FAFSA or the California Dream Act Application (for students without a social security number) between October 1st and March 2nd of their senior year. CSU Stanislaus is offering a free, informational webinar (in both English and Spanish) on October 11th at 5:30 pm. Workshops to complete the FAFSA/CADAA are available to guide students through the process from October through December. Students can sign up through the Class of 2023 Google Classroom. Don't forget that both the student and a parent need an FSA ID to complete the FAFSA. Directions are also available in Google Class of 2023 Classroom under the Classwork section.

What is CTE?

CTE stands for Career Technical Education. CTE Courses are sequenced to create pathways for students in a course of study, which can lead to employment and/or post-secondary education opportunities. This worked based experience and skills can be transferred directly to the workforce. Each campus has multiple CTE Pathways and many of these courses are even articulated to either MJC or Merced Community College so that you can earn college credits at the SAME TIME! Spring MJC Dual Enrollment

Spring MJC Dual Enrollment courses will be posted in October! Dual Enrollment allows students to enroll in high school and college at the **SAME** time. This gives students the opportunity to earn college credits while attending high school! These courses do not appear on your high school transcript or count towards graduation, but will appear on your **COLLEGE** transcript. There are a wide variety of courses that are available online. Students are responsible for books and there is a fee typically not exceeding \$37.00 per semester. Fee waivers are available.

College Applications
